Vision Test

This is a vision test. On these next two pages you will see three pictures. Look at them closely and think about what you see. This will reveal how good your vision is. For this exercise you need to turn your sound up and pay close attention. This is not a chain letter, so you will not be told that if you love Jesus you need to send this newsletter to all the people on your contact list, as well as all the people on their contact lists so that you are sure to clog up the cyber channels. **Hint: you don't really need sound for this exercise since they are only pictures.**

How about the picture on the right? Now that you have the idea, it might be easier to see. You are looking up the hill to the place that Dr. Gomez has named La Puerta del Cielo (the doorway to heaven). It is a small hole in the foliage that divides the property. Look at the top part of the picture. What do you see? Remember to use your deeper vision to look. Do you see what looks like the Holy Land? A replica of the birthplace of Jesus, the garden tomb, or the place where Jesus was crucified. You can't see behind you, but there is a lake where some of the miracles of Jesus are being played out for the children who are visiting the camp. This is the vision of Dr. Hugo's wife, Miriam, who looked at this sight and saw a place where children could interact with the Gospel of Jesus. Are you getting the idea?

One more picture.

Look at the picture on the left. What do you see? To the untrained eye you might only see a lot of trees, plants and rocks. A sharp eye might pick out a bird somewhere, or maybe some banana trees. But that is not what is most important to see. Look harder. There on the right. Do you see some smaller buildings that might be used to house volunteers from all over Central America while they are being trained to use Community Health Evangelism (CHE) to develop communities and build up the church? They would be going to the larger building on the left (can you make it out?) where the classes will be held during the year to prepare these workers and send them out. If you were Dr. Hugo Gomez you would have no problem seeing these things because this is his dream for the property near San Filipe, Guatemala. In April, Global CHE Enterprises (GCE) will partner with the ministry of WorldVenture as they send a family, the Messick's, to help with the work there. In addition to serving on the board of GCE, Jim Thorp serves as the Americas Ministries Director of WorldVenture.

The more you look, the more you see.





Now, look at the photo to the left. What draws your attention to this picture? Does it look like a small group of Guatemalans to you? (Maybe your vision is worse than you thought, because you have already crossed the border into Honduras and these are Honduran church leaders.) But back to the point. Do you see the communities transformed by these people? They enter the community to unite the people around the possibility of better health for them and their children. They are taught the importance of clean water and are provided with a well and filtration systems. They learn how to avoid many of the common diseases that they all face. They learn to cook in stoves that use less wood and channel the smoke out of the house. Many of them have come from lives of drink and wildness. But they have come to trust in Jesus and their lives have been transformed. Do you see the churches being planted in the communities by these workers, or the ones that are going to be planted in the future?

It is all there if you just look with your eyes wide open.

Jim and Corinne Thorp had the privilege of spending a few days in Guatemala and Honduras traveling with Dr. Gomez and visiting these communities, seeing the churches, and talking with these leaders. One church is building an amphitheater that will seat 4,000 people.

Okay, GCE doesn't want you to send this newsletter to anyone else to show that you love Jesus. But if you love the work that Jesus is doing in Central America through CHE, you might consider sending a contribution to the WorldVenture Special Project called AMERICAS-CHE TRAINING CENTER (#6491-907), or by donating to any one of the many GCE projects.
